This month I would like to take you to an inexpensive overlooked wonderful lake within a two

hour drive of Chico. I rarely hear of anyone in the club talk about this lake, but it has wonderful easy access, good cabin accommodations, campgrounds for \$18-20/ night, and a good variety of fish. We are talking rainbows, browns, bookies. kokanee, and mackinaw. The lake sits at 5,158 ft. elevation and has good maps of the lake. I am talking of course about Bucks Lake out of Quincy, Ca. For those of you who want to camp, as I mentioned there are five campgrounds around the lake: Sundew, Low Mill Creek, Lower Bucks, Grizzly Creek, and Whitehorse. If you want a hassle free stay, the Bucks Lake Lodge has cabins that sleep two to four persons ranging in price from about \$100-\$110. Great if you're looking to get in that early or late season fishing trip. You can also book a room in the main lodge. Check in after 3:00 pm Check out time is 11:00 am.

The Hexagenia Hatch at Lake Almanor By Don Sleeper


On June 19, Lincoln Grey, Ray Narbaitz, Pat Sleeper and I hit the Hex hatch. Fishing was fantastic; we caught 17 fish in two hours. The four of us caught fourteen trout (Browns and Rainbows) and three smallmouth on Hex nymphs and surface cripples. We all caught trout, but Ray was the lucky one, he landed six large trout. Lincoln caught the largest a 6 lb brown on a hex nymph with bug eyes. The Hex hatch was in full swing for about an hour with bats coming in at their usual time; and, no grebes (birds that eat Hex nymphs) just big trout surfacing all around us. Quite fun looking around and all you can see are little yellow sail-boats (hex hatch) and trout surfacing like dolphins downing as many of the hex hatch as they can consume. Boat traffic hadn't started yet on a Tuesday night; we had about 10 other float tubes and pontoon boats around us. Later in the month it gets a little crazy, I've counted over a hundred boats off the public launch one July night. Lets all hope the hatch stays with us another month.


