


Our group caught a few each day, but nothing like last year. We had a few large fish 20"-25" but most fish were in the 16"-19" range.

We will be back again next year to solve the mystery. Maybe the weather was too nice, or the wind was not blowing? Who knows? The one thing we do know is that Pyramid has some pretty nice Lahonton Cutthroat and we want another shot at them.


