# Recap: November Guest Speaker: PJ Bock

PJ, frequently found at Fish First! in Chico, gave his presentation on Euro-Nymphing. A few months earlier he gave this presentation for the Project Healing Waters veterans at the Chico Rod and Gun Club.

There are several different styles of Euro-Nymphing. PJ explained that using a longer rod with a longer leader set up coupled with fast sinking nymph patterns allows for one to target specific water runs to catch the residing trout. When I fished with PJ, he used a heavier point nymph with a lighter nymph about 18 inches above off a 4-5 inch tag line. These are tied on to 4-5 feet of lighter tippet which is tied on to a sighter line connected to the nymphing fly line.

The fly rodder keeps a tight line with the flies as they pass through the target zone in the moving water. The longer rod allows one to allow the line to pass with the moving water. At the end of the run, the line is lifted up and repeated at the head of the water run.

While PJ was demonstrating the cast to my on dry land at Deer Creek off the K-Line, a lizard darted out of a pile of rocks and latched on to one of the nymphs. Not exactly what we were going for, but obviously effective. We repeated this process in the water and landed fish!

## Fly of the Month: November 2023 Fly of the Month for June 2013 The Red Headed Step-Child

I was first introduced to the Step-Child by Lance Gray on the Feather River a few years ago. While I was struck by how pretty a fly it was, I was more impressed by the fact that we took a couple of Feather River Steelhead with it. After that, for reasons that defy logic, I decided that it was primarily a Blood Midge pattern. I should have known better, since that's not a fly one sees on the Feather. Still, that's how I fished it for some time. And, I must tell you, it fished rather well. Among other places, it caught fish at Lake McCumber, Siskiyou Lake, Manzanita, Iron Canyon Reservoir, Little Grass Valley Reservoir, and, to this date, landed the biggest fish I have ever pulled out of Lake Almanor, a beautiful, 27- inch Rainbow.

I was brought back to reality by reading an article on the fly in the California Fly Fisher. The Step-Child is from the highly creative mind of Hogan Brown. He pointed out that he designed it to be a Mayfly Nymph imitation. He said it is a little like a Pheasant Tail, but different enough to look like a change from the large number of PT's the fish had probably seen go by. He originally designed it to fish on the Trinity River. I know most people use large flies on the Trinity, but in late winter, there is a small Mayfly hatch that comes off if it isn't too cold. I have taken several fish at that time using a Micro-Mayfly Nymph. The fact that Hogan says it is a Mayfly to fish on the Trinity (or any-place else), is more than good enough for me.

Thread...8/0 Brown
Bead...Red Glass Bead
Tail...Pheasant Tail Fibers
Rib...Small Red Wire
Abdomen...Tying thread

Hook...TMC3769 or any standard Nymph Hook, 14 to 18

Shellback...Medium Mirage Flash or similar product Thorax...Peacock Herl

Legs...Red Krystal Flash

 De-barb hook, place the bead on the hook, and secure hook in the vise.



- 2. Start thread, and tie in P.T. fibers for the tail. Make the tail no longer than the hook shank.
- Tie in the ribbing wire, tie it the full length of the shank in order to keep the body even.
- 4. Wrap a slightly tapered thread body up to about the 2/3 point on the hook.
- Spiral wrap the ribbing wire up the abdomen, tie it off, and break off the excess.
- Tie in the Shellback, making sure it is right on top of the hook (I use silver Holographic Tinsel). Tie it back to the Abdomen.
- Tie in a couple of strands of Peacock Herl at the Abdomen, and wrap them up to the bead. Tie them off and cut off the excess
- 8. Take two strands of the Krystal Flash, and tie them down on the side of the fly. Pull the excess over, and use your thread to tie them down the same way on the other side. The legs should look just like the legs on a P.T.
- Pull the Shellback over the Thorax, and tie it down right behind the bead. Trim off the excess.
- Whip finish right behind the bead, and apply a little head cement.
- 11. Cut the legs off so they are about half the length of the fly.

Notes: In the version that Lance showed me, the Abdomen is tied with Pheasant Tail fibers. It is also a good looking fly, but I like the thin profile of the thread body...I know it is supposed to be a Mayfly Nymph, and I will fish it like one. However, in sizes 16 and 18, it's still a darned good Blood Midge imitation. I doubt that Hogan will have any objections to my fishing it like one.

# **Big Chico Creek Iron Canyon Design Process**By Holly Swan


What does the design process look like for the Iron Canyon Fish Passage Project?

The purpose of the Big Chico Creek Iron Canyon Fish Passage Project is to modify a fish passage barrier in the form of large boulders and high vertical drop to allow two federally listed salmonid species (spring-run Chinook salmon and steelhead trout) and other native fish species access to optimal habitat upstream. Project objectives are to increase water depth at low flow fish passage flows; reduce channel velocity, vertical drops, and overall slope of the channel; increase existing pools or create new pools; and create variable swim paths. This will be accomplished by removing and modifying the current existing instream configuration of boulders. In addition, 17 dilapidated concrete and rebar fish ladder weirs that were constructed in 1956 will be removed from the stream channel. The anticipated modifications will create a natural fishway that will allow for successful fish passage at a range of flow regimes. But how is that done?

The Design Process in Depth: A survey has been conducted for the project reach to support design and document existing channel slopes, boulder configuration, channel width, jump heights, pool depths, bed material, and flow characteristics (i.e., velocity and depth). The survey included low altitude aerial photography from a UAV and/or from the canyon rim to generate a point cloud and high resolution georectified aerial image, ground-base simultaneous localization and mapping (SLAM) of selected areas to map overhangs and sieves between boulders not captured through aerial photogrammetry, single beam sonar for bathymetry of large areas below the water surface, and a total station survey of the channel thalweg, hydraulic controls, and to provide a unique ID for large individual boulders.

In addition to the pre-construction survey of the project reach, a reference reach that fish are known to pass, albeit with difficulty, was identified and surveyed. The reference survey was less robust than the project reach survey but sufficient enough to determine the channel slope, channel width, jump heights, pool depths, bed material, and flow characteristics. The resulting metrics from the reference reach will be used during the design process following a stream simulation design approach where conditions within the design reach are intended to provide similar or better passage conditions when compared to the reference reach.

With this information, a boulder removal plan and conceptual channel design and profile plan will be drafted. These will show which boulders need to be removed from the channel and the anticipated replacement of boulders that will create the hydraulic structures needed for a natural fishway. Even with this conceptual design in hand, the fish passage engineer may make real time decisions on rock placement to create the hydrology needed to ensure fish passage is successful. Once project is completed, resulting channel slopes, channel width, jump heights, and flow characteristics will be determined from the as-built post-construction survey and compared to the design target values for these metrics.


