The Youth Hall of Fame was a direct response to the many hours of dedication and interest to Denton Hill gave to the youth group, which was started in 1986. Denton donated time, tying experience and rod building skills to the classes at the meetings for the children. He has been an avid supporter of the youth group over the years and was the clubs original youth group leader in 1973. Denton ran the youth group for several years. He was also the first recipient of the award in 1998. The 1999 recipient of the award was Roger Bevers. Future recipients of the award can be club members, for support of the youth group, or youth group members themselves who have contributed to their fellow youth member's involvement in youth activities.

The Golden Zipper is our oldest award. Tom Peppas in memory of Walt Konbler first suggested it. Traditionally, it has been presented to the person who "screws" up all that was left of his Levi's was the "zipper". Hence, the names, The Walt Konbler Memorial Trophy, better known as the Golden Zipper. The first recipient (who also received the Hall of Fame award in 1995), Dr. Charlie Beach set a standard that has been hard to surpass but several of "us" have tried. The award is presented to the lucky member by the previous year's recipient. He/She forms a team of three to search out the deserving individual.
