ing in the deep, still water sections of the big holes, therefore, it was difficult to get at them with a fly rod. A couple of people figured them out and connected, but it was the smaller fish for most of us. I caught most of my fish on a #10 Stimulator, so I was very pleased. All trout caught were wild rainbows, it was too early for the steelhead. Don't know if you've seen Big Chico lately, but it is raging! This is exactly what we need to bring in the steelhead, be ready when it drops and clears a bit. And don't forget about Butte Creek, it also hosts some great trout and steelhead fishing. Be sure to try these two streams with that new Xmas fly rod before they close on February 15th, you can catch some nice rainbows and steelhead right here in our own backyard, you can't get any more local than these two streams.
