On December 21, 2005, your Board met and covered a number of items including the following:

-Our new President handed out binders for each Board Member and each Officer, which are to be used for making each position as effective and efficient as possible. They will be passed on as new officers are elected to provide some continuity for the respective positions. Generally applauded as a great idea.

-Our annual Anchovy Feed this month was considered to be a good success. Some 33 people attended the event.

-The Annual Dinner
Organization/Responsibility List was distributed with respective assignments for the upcoming event on February 24, 2006.

-With respect to donations, it was emphasized that we really need to have everyone helping out in this area. It was agreed that Lionel would e-mail his list of donors to Roger, et al. so everyone could be aware of those donors and avoid duplication of solicitations.

-Eric discussed some conservation issues. In particular, there are some significant changes coming on the Feather River including the building of two weirs, which will segregate the spring run salmon from the fall salmon.

-Eric also advised that one of our 2005 auction bidders needed an alternative to the Oasis Springs Certificate as a result of some changes that they made to the certificates. 
Fish Report from Upper Klamath River (east of Hwy 5)

Terry Mich, Karen Horne, Pat, and I fished with guides Jim Roberts and Chuck on the upper Klamath River November 16th. Fishing was terrific! We hooked 17 steelhead and 20+ small trout and salmon; the largest steelhead was about 7 pounds. That's a big fish for the Klamath. Terry caught the biggest, and the most, as always!

We put in at the fish hatchery below Iron Gate Dam with two drift boats and floated almost 8 miles. We used a little of every thing from small prince nymphs to large black rubber legged stoneflies. The larger fish seemed to like the big ugly stoneflies. Karen and Pat both had at least three rigs break offs with "big" fish!

Karen started out with her small four-weight rod and the guide quickly noted she was out gunned and switched her to his heavier rod. The trip down the river was beautiful, the weather was great until the sun went down and the temp dropped into the 30's; but by that time we were taking off our waders. For a great fishing trip on the upper Klamath River, I highly recommend Jim Roberts (530-245-0906) and his guides. Chuck was absolutely awesome! (See Pictures below)
