



#### 'Damn Good' Damsel

Over the years, the traditional damsel nymph's body was poorly imitated by tying on a marabou tail for a little swimming action. The rest of the bug's body was tyed around the hook shank. This did not even remotely imitate the lively swimming action of at least 1/2 of the nymph's body.

If you like the thought of landing nice fish during a damsel migration (like the big one on Davis Lake during most of the summer), when no one else



can, then you need to attend this session.

#### **Materials:**

- Hook: Scud TMC #12
- Ostrich: Olive, med brown, yellow
- Marabou: Olive, med brown, yellow

Recommended tippet size is 3x minimum. Full sinking lines with a slow to medium sink rate work the best, but sink tips are okay also. We will be camping at Mill Creek falls campground out of Likely. The weather is unpredictable, so be prepared We also do allot of driving between lakes, so bring a dependable vehicle. If you've never been to Modoc, I highly recommend it. We will have a sign-up sheet at the next meeting. If you can't make the meeting or have questions call Mark or Jeff at 893-1600 during the day at NorthStar Engineering.

The July fishout will be on July 26 and 27 on the Pit River. Bring your felt shoes and wading staffs to this one because the wading is difficult. We will camp at the Burney Falls campground which is about 20 minutes from where we fish. More information will follow.
