

we know about the fishing.

For those of you who will not be staying in the cabin, the best bet is to use the Cal Trout access at the Island Bridge. There is a parking lot that holds about 6 vehicles and no trailers. You must walk your boat about 50 yards to the river. Gas motors are not allowed. To get to the Cal

Trout access take 299 past Burney and Johnson Park. Just before you get to Fall River Mills, turn left on Glenburn Road. Turn Right when you get to the end, then turn left at the church onto McArthur Road. The road will form a "Y". Go right at the "Y" onto Island Road. Turn right just after the bridge into the Cal Trout lot. Once you are on the river it should not be hard to find club members. We will have at least 8 of us in boats on the water (looking the part of an organized team of flyfishers).

Small birds nests, zug bugs, pt's, bead heads all work well as does leaches. For fishing dries, pale morning duns, sizes 16-18 work well to rising fish. It's tough fishing but well worth the effort.

It looks like all of the spots will be taken at Circle 7, but if you are interested give me a call as someone may drop out. Vaughn's Fly Shop in Burney or Trout Country in Johnson can let you know what is happening. Hat Creek, the Pitt etc. are always good choices too. Ron Leger 343-5191.


#### THANK YOU VERY **MUCH ROGER!**

# **LOCAL WATERS**

Local Waters will host articles on local fishing waters and locations, public or private . . . please enjoy this review.

# — BIG BLUFF RANCH —

If you're looking for something new, there's a great place to go that's just up the road from Chico. Big Bluff Ranch has a wonderful lake. It's big (25 acres), it's deep (more than 50 feet), and it's private, quiet, and beautiful. There is a great variety of physical structure: sunken trees, shallow water, steep banks, deep water, the list is almost endless. Behind a locked gate, surrounded by miles of private property, this is private water.

The ranch is nestled in the foothills west of Red Bluff. It's about three miles from the north fence to the south. East to west is roughly two miles. A year round county maintained gravel road runs along the eastern boundary. The lake, in the center of the ranch, is a foothill reservoir. It is framed by hills covered with blue pine, manzanita, and oak trees. To the west, you see the chaparral covered watershed which catches the water to fill the lake almost every winter. Beyond the chaparral is the Yolla Bolly Wilderness Area. In every other direction, there are miles of undeveloped foothill rangeland.

The lake was stocked in 1983 with Largemouth Bass, Channel Catfish, and Red Ear Sunfish. These fish have now lived (and survived!) their entire lives in this reservoir. The largest catfish now weigh over 13 pounds, the largest bass was recorded at 9 pounds 6 ounces, and the record sunfish is almost two pounds.

But our big news for 1998 is trout. On the last day of 1997 we planted a truckload of 2 to 4 pound rainbow trout. They are a Rainbow-Steelhead cross, renowned for growing quickly to trophy size and putting up a fight! These gorgeous, healthy fish are ready for action.

Big Bluff Ranch offers both day fishing and overnight accommodations. We limit the number of anglers and rest the lake periodically to maintain quality fishing. Our lakeside screened cabin is right at the water's edge. It has four bunks for sleeping bags, a gas barbecue with a cook ring, basic kitchen utensils, a composting toilet and a shower at the "outhouse." The cabin offers deluxe camping with a beautiful view and complete isolation. Only one party of 4 to 6 people is booked at a time. We are open year around, but in the wet months a good rain can make the lake inaccessible for up to a week.
