You will have to attend the fishout to figure out the attraction to this area of California I like to call "God's Country".

If you go, bring every line you own, and every fly as well. If you don't have a cameo intermediate line or a type II sinking line go get one. 6 wts work well,

and will be tested by the wind and the fish. The flies in the "must have" category would be woolly buggers all sizes and colors. If you want to land the big ones, I would not fish with anything smaller than 3x.

The central gathering area will be the Mill Creek campground located east of Likely on 395 near Clear lake in the Warner Mountains.
