Many CAF members have wondered what the club does with the funds that we raise, so I have prepared a summary of where the money goes. I will spend the bulk of this column briefly describing these organizations and how much we donate to them. These descriptions are based upon my knowledge of these organizations, and some serious plagiarism from their respective websites and publications. I doubt they will mind.

The CAF board donates to a variety of conservation organizations, some on an annual basis, others on a one-time or periodic basis. However, it should be noted that the board evaluates all of the recipients each year, regardless whether they are "regulars" or not.


