FEBRUARY MEETING

The February CAF Meeting featured Stacy Cepello with the California Dept. of Water Resources, who presented "The Sacramento River Conservation Area." Stacy used a very impressive GIS computer program that projected wonderful aerial photos and detailed maps of the SRCA, which has the goal of preserving what remains of the natural Sacramento River riparian habitat, and reestablishing a continuous riparian corridor along the Sacramento River from Redding to Verona, a distance of about 200 miles. The SRCA has already begun, and when complete, the SRCA would total 312,000 acres, with the inner river zone being the most critical. The inner river zone is the main focus of the SCRA, this area totals about 30,000 acres and floods every 2.5 years, making it the most difficult area for agriculture. The SRCA will acquire these lands through conservation agreements with pri-



vate landowners, and the purchase of lands from willing sellers using privately donated funds, Federal Refuge and State Wildlife Area funds, and other State, Federal and local sources. Some very interesting subjects were raised during the Q&A session. It appears that the public access issues have not all been worked out, hunting will be allowed only on some of these lands, and initially, only on the State lands. It also appears that some of the current and proposed actions to protect and restore threatened and endangered Sacramento River salmon and steelhead, particularly those actions involv-



tion along the Sac-

ramento River.

ing increased summer flows, may impact the ability to restore some of the native riparian vegetation along the Sacramento River. However, in all likelihood, the fish will continue to take precedence.
