
The Story of the Big Chico Creek Fishing Regulations Change

On July 24, 2001, seven private landowners in the upper Big Chico Creek watershed (Ken Grossman, Steve Bickley, Jim Crane, Roger Mathews, Katie Gonser, Hans Schroeder, and Dulcy Schroeder) sent a letter to the California Fish and Game Commission (Commission) requesting a closure to all fishing on Big Chico Creek from Bear Hole upstream to Higgins Hole Falls. Essentially, the entire trout fishing section. They based their request on concerns for spring-run chinook salmon and steelhead, but did not explain how the current fishing regulations, which already were highly restrictive (seasonal closures, catch and release, artificial lures with barbless hooks), were harming the fish populations in the creek. Nonetheless, the California Department of Fish and Game went along with this proposal, and decided to take it one step further and proposed to open the section below Bear Hole to bait fishing with barbed hooks for 4 months of the year. The Chico Area Flyfishers opposed these changes in several letters, petitions, and public testimony before the Commission; the basis for CAF's opposition was simple: special regulations were already in effect on the stream, closing it to fishing would not enhance the fish populations so the result would be an unjustified loss of a public fishery. CAF pointed out that the proposal was based on the assumption that the current regulations are harming the fich and needed to be

The Chico Area Flyfishers opposed these changes in several letters, petitions, and public testimony before the Commission; the basis for CAF's opposition was simple: special regulations were already in effect on the stream, closing it to fishing would not enhance the fish populations so the result would be an unjustified loss of a public fishery. CAF pointed out that the proposal was based on the assumption that the current regulations were harming the fish and needed to be changed, yet the private landowners and DFG had not provided any information, data, or studies to support this claim. They did not explain how closing the fishery was going to increase the fish populations, evidence that this proposal was not based on good science.

The end result is that all fishing on Big Chico Creek has been closed from Higgins Hole Falls it is only open from the upper boundown to the

upper boundary of the Big Chico Creek Ecological Reserve, and dary of the Reserve to Bear Hole from November 15 to February 15, a 3-month winter fishery. For the first time in Chico's history, spring and summertime trout fishing will not be allowed on Big Chico Creek in Upper Bidwell Park, and October fishing on the new Preserve lands has also been eliminated. The last two weeks of February have been cut off as well.

In the next few weeks, CAF will be constructing a page on our website that will provide information that documents the events that led up to this closure, it will also provide the letters that CAF sent on this subject, and links to other websites with related information. Hopefully, this page on our website will be a useful tool to allow the public more opportunity to make sure its interests are truly being represented in the future. Also, CAF intends to continue to pursue this issue. CAF will petition the Fish and Game Commission to re-open the stream to at least the former regulations, unless it is actually determined, using good science, that the closure will result in increases to the salmon and steelhead populations in Bia Chico Creek.
