
BIG FISH

Now is the time of year that the lakes and streams are cooling down, the days are getting shorter, and the big fish are putting on the feed bag in preparation for winter. Living in the North State, there are several excellent opportunities to connect with a Rainbow or German Brown in the 5-10 pound range. Or, if you want to travel a little bit further, the Stripers will be starting to school up in the San Joaquin Delta.

For a short day trip, there is potential fishing as close as Lake Oroville. Just cruise the Lake and look for the schooling shad minnows that are being chased by the larger fish. A brightly colored streamer fly can produce excellent results.

If you have a little more time, it is always worth a trip up to Eagle Lake for the large Rainbows that will be cruising the weed beds on the north end of the lake. Here a woolly worm or woolly bugger can produce



excellent results and shatter most

fisherman's nerves.

Mentioned earlier, the San Joaquin Delta is the place for Striper in the month of November. They will be starting to school up in preparation for spawning. Grab your deceivers and other large flies and head down to the Delta. Catching Stripers in the 15-25 pound range is entirely possible this time of year.

Another overlooked item is the potential for hooking into a large Black or Small Mouth Bass this time of year. As Jim Gaumer and Dick Murrill showed us at the general meeting a couple of months ago, November can provide some excellent Bass fishing in the Oroville wilderness area, and in some of the numerous sloughs off of the Sacramento River.

INVESTMENT COMMITTEE REPORT

Lionel Valley, Chairman-Investment Committee

At the request of the CAF Board of Directors, an investment committee was formed to review our finances and investment alternatives for CAF funds. The committee is comprised of Don Bowlby, Jeff Richelieu, Doug Smith, and myself as chairman.

The committee was formed because the Board was concerned with the average balance of some \$9,500.00 in our club's checking account and the interest gain of 1%. Our minimum balance was about \$6,000 and our maximum balance is about \$23,000. Even in today's world of low inflation of some 3% we are effectively losing purchasing power.

It appears reasonable and prudent to consider an investment of \$2,500 for 5 years and another \$2,500 for 3 years. We can always access any of these funds at any time, but that we need those kinds of time periods to attempt to maximize our return.

We searched and came to the conclusion to consider mutual funds with solid track records for at least 5 and 10 years. We voted to invest \$2,500 in Mutual Beacon which was formed in 1961 with a 10 year annualized return of 14.5% per year after expenses, for the period ending 3/31/97. The fund would be for the 5 year or longer investment dollar.

The other \$2,500 in MFS Total Return which was formed in 1970 with a 10 year annualized return of 10.2% per year after expenses for the period ending 3/31/97. This fund would be for the 3 year or longer investment dollars.

The two combined investments would yield your club an annualized return of 12.5% most likely, with a best case return of some 15.5% and a worst case return of some 9.1%. That means that we should be able to improve our cash flow from some \$250 to some \$4,300 for a 5 year period with the \$5,000 - an improvement of about \$4,000!
