Where else can you live, where within a 2 hour drive you can catch, steelhead, about ½ dozen species of trout, Chinook salmon, shad, striped bass, 4 species of black bass, crappie, catfish, as well as hunt ducks, geese, doves, pheasants, quail, turkeys, deer, and bear? And do many of these activities December - April? Every time someone comes up with a better place to do something, such as steelheading in British Columbia, salmon in Alaska, Montana trout fishing, I ask them how the fishing was in February? Sure those locations are hard to beat when they are at their peak, but I had one of my best fishing days of the year on Big Chico Creek on February 27th, with my shirt sleeves rolled up and sunscreen on my face. I doubt it got much above freezing in those other places. And that wasn't even close to California's peak. What about those Pit River 20 inchers on opening day? That largemouth erupting onto the surface of a small pond at dusk in June, chasing a noisily presented hair bug. In a Montana tackle shop this last July, I smiled and nodded as a couple of locals told me how bad the fishing was in California, and how they couldn't understand how I could take it. 
NOV GENERAL MEETING


