

The October fishout to Bridgeport was a huge success for the four in attendance. Myself, Mark Adam, and Don and Val Bowlby enjoyed a great weekend of fishing and sight seeing.

If you haven't been to Bridgeport on Hwy 395 south of Carson City, you should put it on your list of places to visit in California. This is truly one of the most beautiful parts of the state and when you factor in the fishing it is a must for flyfisherman. It's only a 5 hour drive from Chico with fantastic scenery along the way.

The flows on the East Walker dropped from 170 cfs (optimum fishing level) to 40 cfs (bring your own water to fish in) the day we ar-

rived. We were still optimistic and went fishing anyway. We man-

aged to catch some nice browns and bows on a nymph and indicator rig, but not the 20" + trophies that were being taken two days earlier with the higher flows. The nice folks at Ken's Sporting Goods put us onto the



West Walker River which is north of Bridgeport. This is where the fishing really improved. Mark and I managed to land 25 fish in a few hours time that were all fat 12" to 15" rainbows. Several of these scrappy fish took some line off our spools. We had bald eagles, osprey, hawks, and numerous coyotes nearby for company, but not too many people. The snow capped mountains and yellow aspens were another bonus.

Another great fishout!
