LAKE DAVIS WATER LEVELS ARE SIGNIFI-CANTLY DOWN FROM LAST YEAR. AUGUST 2000 LEVEL WAS 61755 COMPARED TO AU-GUST 2001 LEVEL OF 47398. I TALKED WITH GUIDE JON BIACHI ON 9/17/01. HE SAID THAT WE SHOULD ACCESS THE LAKE ON THE EAST SIDE AND FISH THE NORTH SIDE OF THE LAKE. THE MEETING PLACE WILL BE AT Lightning Tree boat ramp on the east side of the lake I AM PLAN-NING TO BE THERE AT 7:30 A.M. FLOAT TUBES, PONTOON BOATS, AND CAR TOP BOATS CAN BE LAUNCHED HERE. TRAILERED BOATS CAN BE LAUNCHED AT HONKER COVE. CAMP 5 LAUNCH WILL BE HIGH AND DRY. HOT COLORS FOR WOOLY BUGGERS SIZE 6 TO 10 ARE CI-NAMMON, HOT ORANGE, BURNT ORANGE, ROOTBEER, OLIVE, AND PEACOCK. SNAIL PAT-TERNS IN SIZES 8 TO 10 SHOULD BE IN COL-ORS ROOTBEER, BURNT ORANGE, OLIVE AND PEACOCK AND ARE MADE WITH MARABOU AND LONG SHUCK CRYSTAL CHENILLE. OTHER FLYS TO BRING ARE CALLEBATIS, BLOOD MIDGE PUPA IN SIZE 10 TO 14, AND WIGGLE FLIES. FLOATING LINES WITH INDICA-TORS ON THE LEADER 31/2 TO 4 FEET UP FROM THE FLY SHOULD WORK. SLOW INTER-MEDIATE SINK LINES ARE PROBABLY THE BEST. 3X TIPPET WILL BE REQUIRED DUE TO WEEDS AND STRONG FISH . POINTS, SANDY AREAS, CHANNELS IN THE WEEDS, DEEP WA-TER BREAK OFF AREA, AND SCUM LINES WILL BE GOOD AREAS TO LOCATE FISH. STREAM-ERS MAY PRODUCE THE RARE BROWN TROUT OR POSSIBLY A PIKE. 
